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

PROBLEM STATEMENT

- Boston Police Department is below the national average in clearance rates – which currently stands at 60%.
- ❖ Between 2007 and 2011, the BPD Homicide Unit cleared 44.3% (139 of 314 cases) of homicide cases investigated during this time period.

HOMICIDES IN BOSTON

- Gun homicides and gun assault incidents are typically concentrated in less than 5% of Boston's land mass
- ❖ 79% of homicide cases between 2007-2011 were committed with a firearm
- 50% of cases were identified as gang-related



GOALS

- Increase Homicide Clearance Rates in Boston
- Creation of a business model for homicide investigation based on best practices and evidence based research
- Standardized and consistent system of homicide response and investigation that demands professionalism, accountability and sustainability

KEY TACTICS AND INITIATIVES

Phase I Oct. 1, 2011 – Sept. 30, 2012

- Strategic Planning Process with BPD HAC to create BPD specific recommendations for policy, procedure and protocol improvements
- Creation of a Commissioner's Memorandum, and Supporting Power Point Presentation to aid in the implementation of the new homicide investigation and response process
- Convening of BPD personnel for presentation and orientation of new model
- Creation of a carousel video staring the Police Commissioner to "kick-off" Phase II implementation of new model


- October 1: Kick off Implementation Date

- Final Report Dr. Anthony Braga






Figure 1. 3i Model of Intelligence-led Policing adapted from Ratcliffe

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Situational Awareness Suspicious Package at Charlestown High School Friday, May 21, 2010

On 5/21/10 at approximately 10:31 AM, a suspicious package and some written material rel to Islam were found in a teacher's classroom at Charlestown High School located at 240 Medford St. The package appears to have been there since Wednesday, 5/19/10. The school briefly evacuated; however, students have safely returned to their classrooms

The bomb squad removed the package and the materials were reviewed by detectives. In addition, detectives interviewed the teacher and it was determined that the package was a car case that belonged to the school and the materials were not of an inflammatory nature. This incident has no nexus to terrorism.


