# Why Smart Policing?

The evidence base for police effectiveness is not strong

A 2010 review of over 5,500 police intervention research studies (Weisburd, et al.) found about 10 that met scientific standards for methodological rigor that warranted confidence in the conclusions reported

### Smart Policing: Is it "new"?

#### Honors Peele's principles

- Mission -- prevent crime and disorder
- Ability of police to perform their duties is dependent upon public approval of police actions
- Test of police efficiency is the absence of crime and disorder, not the visible evidence of police action in dealing with it
- Smart Policing recognizes the dynamic nature of crime, communities, and criminals
- Police agencies have to be 'smarter' to be successful, these days...





## **Smart Policing Today**

- Smart Policing is not a prescription
- Smart Policing is a natural evolution toward more systematic development and utilization of research (scientific logic) and analysis (scientific techniques) in policing and public safety
- Progress requires struggle (mistakes, criticism), reflection, learning





### **Smart Policing Today**

- What we are learning:
  - Innovation does not come easy
  - Institutional and organizational cultural barriers
    - External researchers
    - Supporting internal research and analysis
    - Economic struggles → less experimentation (when more is required)
  - Outreach & Inreach
  - Sustainability, too, suffers from organizational and institutional limitations





### **Smart Policing Today**

- Effective research relationships increase vision and perspective
- Technology is exciting, can lead to important organizational efficiencies and outcomes
- Meaningful, helpful, change in policing is not prescribed......it is discovered through focused, collaborative, deliberate work toward innovation; research (and researchers) can be helpful

# What Smart Policing means to your Department/Organization

- Building Partnerships and Cultivating Trust with Culturally-Diverse Communities to Prevent Crimes.
- Utilizing Crime Analysis to develop Appropriate Responses and Deploy Resources more Strategically and Effectively.
- Documenting our Process and Outcomes through Scientific Analysis.
- Measuring Progress through our Research Findings and Making Necessary Adjustments.
- Institutionalizing Change throughout the Agency based on the research results.





#### Our SPI Goals are threefold:

\* To Cultivate Trust and Collaboration with the Immigrant Community, and to Empower Residents to Report Crimes and take Proactive Stances against Victimization.

- \* To Educate Residents on Crime Prevention and Risky Behaviors such as, Carrying Cash, Loitering, and Consuming Alcohol in Public.
- To Proactively Investigate Robberies and Track Robbery Suspects.

# Our Primary Strategies Include:

- Hiring a Civilian Community Liaison to serve as Community Advocate and Intermediary between Law Enforcement and the Community.
- Implementing Positive Outreach Events to Build Trust and Culturally Appropriate Interventions to Prevent Crime.
- Re-assigning a Dedicated Robbery Detective to Investigate all Robberies in the Target Community and to Work Closely with the Liaison to Follow-Up with Victims and Encourage them to Cooperate.





## Examples of Initiatives/Tactics:

- Community Picnic to Introduce the Liaison to the Community.
- Unity Soccer Cup Tournament with a Law Enforcement Team to Build Trust.
- Monthly Presentations to ESOL Classes to Provide Information on Behaviors that Increase Risk of Victimization.
- ❖Guatemalan ID Event to Provide Passports, Identification Cards to Facilitate Opening of Bank Accounts.

## Examples of Initiatives/Tactics:

- Business Camera Initiative to deter Crime/Robberies in Certain Hotspot Areas.
- A Town Hall Forum to allow Residents to Voice their concerns with Law Enforcement and at the same time, allow Law Enforcement to Share Information of their Efforts.
- Proactive Patrols with the Community Policing Team to gather Intelligence on Offenders and identify At-Risk Behaviors.
- Tracking Ex-Offenders through "Knocks and Talks" to ensure compliance

## Examples of Initiatives/Tactics:

- \*Court-Ordered Conditions and to Refer them to any services that may facilitate their re-entry into the Community.
- Utilizing U-Visas to Gain Victim Cooperation.
- Partnering with the Media to Publicize our Efforts with the Community.





# What are the Progress, Findings, and Outcomes

**Key Outcome:** Reduction in Robberies

Research Findings Reveal (Crime Data):

- An initial Increase in Robbery Reporting during the early intervention period (April-Sept 2010) which may be a consequence of the outreach efforts to engage the community and encourage them to report crimes.
- \* A reduction in Robberies during the midintervention period (October-December 2011) from an average of 9.3 per month to 7.3 per month.





# What Changes or Influence has the Police-Researcher Relationship had on our Agency?

- \*Having a Researcher intricately Involved with our agency validates our efforts with the Community.
- The Research Partnership provides a Layer of Accountability to Police Management to Carefully Assess a problem before rushing to Implement a Response.
- It has helped Police Supervisors to Closely Examine Data and Employ Evidence-Based Solutions to Maximize Results.





# How Research and Analysis is Affecting Specific Strategies and Tactics?

- The Research Partnership has also provided a level of legitimacy and transparency with community stakeholders since we share our results with the public through newspaper articles, radio segments, community forums, and a PSA which is in progress.
- Through our CompSTAT process and Executive-Level Meetings, our Research Partner has shared results with District Commanders and they, in turn, are informally adopting many of the interventions within their jurisdiction.

## **Evidence-based Policing**

Of all the ideas in policing, one stands out as the most powerful force for change: police practices should be based on scientific evidence about what works best.

Early in this century, Berkeley Police Chief August Vollmer's partnership with his local university helped generate this idea (Carte and Carte 1975)

### Our Program

We scan and analyze all sources of information to develop data that identifies potential threats to people and places with focus on high risk offenders when appropriate.

Then we utilize structured communication systems to provide real time intelligence to all officers to *eliminate* and/or *mitigate* the threats and *neutralize the offender* (s)

#### Background

The Evans County Sheriff's Office Intelligence Led Police Collaborative.

RESOURCES

Evans County is located near the coast of Georgia, 52 miles southwest of Savannah, Georgia. The population of Evans County is 12,000. Four municipalities are located in Evans County, two of which have police departments, Claxton, population 3,000, has eight police officers and Hagan, population 2,000, has four police officers. Evans County Sheriff's Office has 12 Deputies. Tri-Circuit Drug Task Force is a multi-jurisdictional task force that is based in Claxton and serves four neighboring counties and is made up of seven agents.

Our agencies, like the majority of rural police departments and sheriff's offices in our country, have few personnel, few resources, and poor communications. These small departments change shifts without the benefit of "roll call" briefings, intelligence sharing or information to focus patrols, or put facts together to identify criminal activity, Many times the evening officers arrive on shift from all three agencies without any knowledge whatsoever about what went on in their jurisdictions or each others. The assumption that the right hand knows what the left hand is doing is false. Moreover, the many opportunities to prevent, disrupt, or make arrest in criminal activities are lost.

#### The introduction of an Intelligence Led Policing strategy changed our world.

The Evans County Sheriff's Office staffs a fulltime Intelligence Analyst that is responsible for proactive information analysis and sharing. Our analyst strays from the traditional investigative resource type of work to a proactive scanning to seek and identify threats from criminal elements and/or public safety and order maintenance issues afoot.

#### THE VISION

The Evans County Sheriff's Office wanted to use "Smart Phone" i.e. I-phone or Droid technologies (The latest and greatest) to connect all Deputies and City Police Officers together for e-mail communications from a structured LISTSERV that an E-Roll Call could be sent to each officer daily. Further, Evans County wanted to send intelligence products through the LISTSERV to reach each officer "real time".

The "smart phone" technology would enhance communications, provide access to the internet, promote safety with GPS tracking and

possess applications for interpreting Spanish, seeing Doppler weather radar real time and being of meaningful utility to the deputy/officer.

The "smart phone" was a phone, GPS tracker and finder, internet portal and the functional equivalent of a portable "on person" lap top computer.

This technology would be the "cornerstone" to the intelligence led policing program by providing the means to export information to each and every officer in seconds.

We really wanted to use the I-phone or Droid technology.

#### Gunfight at Casa leads to 4 arrests

What some investigators characterized as a "gunfight" in the Casa del Carmen neighborhood north of Claxton early Sunday evening left one person hospitalized and has led to four arrests.

Chief Deputy John Edwards at the Evans County Sheriff's Office said that one man was transported to Memorial University Medical Center in Savannah with a gunshot wound that was not considered life-threatening. According to investigators, as many as eight people were involved in an altercation that included an outdoor exchange of gunfire.

Most were reportedly Spanish speaking, and the lack of an interpreter slowed investigators' efforts to identify them. By Tuesday morning, four people were being held at the Evans County Jail in connection with the incident, but the Sheriff's Office had not released a report with their names.

"We have made arrests, but the drawback is we are waiting for further identification," said ECSO Investigator Virgil De-Loach.

The Georgia Bureau of Investigation is assisting the sheriff's department in the case. Later Tuesday, the ECSO released the names of four individuals charged with % ffray, but none identified yet as the shooter.



# 'Gunfight' suspects deported, come back, are detained again

Two men who were arrested after a May 9 "gunfight" in the Casa del Carmen neighborhood north of Claxton were subsequently deported to Mexico, but had returned to Evans County last week when Sheriff Randall Tippins made sure that federal immigration officials knew it.

Investigators said at the time that as many as eight people were involved in the May 9 altercation that included an outdoor exchange of gunfire that Sunday night.

One man, also a Mexican national believed to be in the United States illegally, was hospitalized with a gunshot wound.

Although officials said in

May that the injury wasn't life threatening, Tippins says the man lost his vision in at least one eye as a result.

Four people were arrested, but investigators were unable to identify the shooter with any certainty, and those arrested were charged only with misdemeanors.

If people in the U.S. illegally are charged with felonies, they are held awaiting trial and potentially serve any sentences in American prisons. But if they are charged only with misdemeanors, federal immigration authorities often deport them without waiting for state legal proceedings.

Jesus Ramirez and Tereso Ramirez Rito, charged May 9 with misdemeanor affray in connection with the Casa del Carmen fight, were released to U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, or ICE, on May 27 and deported to Mexico.

Last week, the sheriff received information that the two men had re-entered the United States and were on their way back to Evans County.
